Regulations and Safety Rules

- No camping along trail or at access areas
- No open fires
- Please keep horses out of crop fields
- Follow safe riding practices
- Be alert to hazardous crossings and low limbs
- Horses should not enter lake
- Show consideration to other riders on trail
- Ride horses only on designated trails
- To prevent damaging trails, avoid riding when trails are wet
- Help keep our trails clean. Do not litter.

Smithville Lake, Missouri

Smithville Lake offers 26 miles of horse/ hiking trail on the southeast side of the lake. The trail begins at Crow's Creek Campground in Bauman Park, and ends in Arley, Missouri. The primary trailheads at Crow's Creek Campground, Crow's Nest, and Jack Rabbit Bend offer ample trailer parking. They are accessed from E Highway/164th St. Accesses 22, 23, and 24 are reached from Quinn Road. Accesses 20, 21, and 31 are located off of C Highway. Crow's Creek Campground offers 90 primitive camping spots for equestrians. Restrooms, showers, laundry and water hydrants are conveniently located. The area features a variety of rolling and flat terrain, with many creek crossings. Fields of native warm-season grasses and row crops are scattered among the timber areas. The trails are located on lands open for public hunting. Maximize your safety and enjoyment by avoiding periods of intense hunting. The trail consists of a shoreline trail that is marked with orange indicators, and a boundary trail marked with white indicators. Lettered locator posts have been placed at various locations along the trail to help riders reference their location on a map. Maps are available at primary trailheads.
